Riding Along with an Experienced County Hunter Mobile

This year I wanted to get out and do some CW in the Ohio QSO Party. In the past I've stopped as I enter a new county to operate. Now I wanted to see what it was like to operate while in motion. Of course this would require a driver. After talking to some of the local drag racers, I was not satisfied. Someone suggested an experienced county hunter mobile. Now I've known Ed - **K8ZZ** for a long time. When asked he consented to drive out from Minnesota, assuring me that this would be FUN.

Ed arrived in Ohio a few days before the QSO Party, and we got to work preparing his RAV-4, which was already equipped with a heavy-duty screwdriver. We added one of my 40 meter Hamsticks on a magnetic base. Preparing the N1MM+ software special QSO Party module required a bit of learning and time. Eventually it was working "most of the time." We put my K3S in the backseat and decided to take a test drive the day before the contest. Everything seemed to go haywire! The software became troublesome, the K3S would shut down, and the SWR was tough to tame. We eventually figured it was an RF problem. Now Ed had

done a whole lot with grounding, and it made his front seat mobile operation very smooth. But, with cables hither and yon in the backseat, a lot of work needed to be done. When we hit the sack on Friday, all was well. On Saturday, the day of the QP, we went to breakfast and checked everything out in the parking lot at the restaurant. Everything ran perfectly, and we headed out for our opening county. About 10 miles later I noticed that my laptop had totally bit the dust! Now what? Well, I love to send CW so that is no problem. Hand logging would also have to do. Oh, and we couldn't find the connector convertor for the headphones, so we'd have to listen to the speaker, which was right behind Ed's head!

On the road, I learned a lot about a county hunter driver! First of all, he loves to take short cuts to destinations -- this usually means bumpy gravel roads, which put your dental fillings in peril, let alone making CW sending and particularly hand logging a real challenge! It also seemed to me that we were probably on the hunt for Dairy Queens in most of the counties that we entered! How could that happen? On one of the shortcuts, I really think I saw a sign advertising a Ben Franklin Festival! Ed, are we actually in PA? NO, Don, you're imagining things! I also noted that we were often traveling at about 20 MPH on some of the roads that were mostly used by livestock! Ed, do you think those cows are upset? NO, Don, they're used to county hunters. ED, that bull in front of us doesn't seem to be happy!

By the time we actually got to paved roads, the radio conditions had improved, but the two operators had sore ears from high volume CW coming from the radio speaker. There were a lot of HUHS and WHATS whenever we tried to communicate!

The road home consisted of additional bumps and jerks, but we continued to make contacts. I suppose the paper log will be able to be deciphered by government forensic experts, or handwriting specialists!



USACA AWARD STATUS By Kerry W4SIG

Please be patient with us as we wrap up some details before making everything official. We will keep you updated as we progress.



It's funny what comes to mind on a few dark winter nights. I thought about finishing my project of photographing all 85 courthouses in Arkansas (yes, 85... 10 counties have two county seats for various reasons). Then I thought about finishing running the state parks I hadn't done yet for the Parks on the Air (POTA) program. From those thoughts morphed the idea of running Arkansas' one National Park, 52 state parks, and all 75 counties. And to make it more interesting, I would do this only on CW to promote this mode and offer some nice prizes to increase interest. Bits and pieces came together and I advertised the idea and contest rules in the various county hunting, POTA, and QRZ sites.

By May, I was ready to start on the road. The actual operation was in seven phases and to match my other commitments and weather. The first date was May 9th and the last on June 28th. Unfortunately, the propagation gods didn't cooperate, and I tried to operate thru CMEs, blackouts, and just plain poor conditions most of the time. Bands used were 40, 30, 20, 17 and 15 running about 80 watts with my long-suffering Icom706MKIIG. The Hustler resonators were on two separate masts – one holding 40 and 30, the other 20, 17, and 15. So, if you were wondering why I had some time lapses while switching bands, it was because I had to physically change the masts! Poor technique, I suppose, but it worked in the long run.

I quickly learned the POTA operators weren't too interested, for the most part - most of them only operate SSB or FT4/8. I did get a few here and there, but most of the contacts were with regular county hunting folks (mostly very familiar calls) or folks just tuning around the bands.

Arkansas' only national park - Hot Springs - was run on May 9th as well as the first state park - Lake Ouachita - both in Garland county. I tried to run the NW area of the state first, NE second, SE third, and the SW last. The last state park - Historic Washington- was run on June 28th, also being in the last county - Hempstead.

A total of 4,175 miles were driven with 1,416 CW contacts. Band totals: 40 meters (183), 30 meters (449), 20 meters (499), 17 meters (198) and 15 meters (87).

After checking the logs, the following stations qualified for the various prizes:

- 1. Worked most counties: W0GXQ with 53
- 2. Second place most counties: K7REL with 45
- 3. Worked most national/state parks: NN9K with 32
- 4. Second place most national/state parks: NU0Q with 25
- 5. Canadian most counties: VA3UZ with 4
- 6. Second place Canadian most counties: VE3LDT with 2
- 7. European most counties: DL9USA with 5 (earliest contact)
- 8. Second place European most counties: SM2SUM with 5

Thanks to all the county hunters who chased me during this interesting trip around my home state. I was able to finish my photo gallery of all the county courthouses as well as see a number of new state parks.


