## **USA-SSB Award Changes**

### The MARAC USA-SSB Award Rule Change Explained

SSB operators who have earned the USA-CA WBOW and multiple times awards should read this article. Recent changes to the USA-SSB Award rules by MARAC are significant, and it is now possible that you can apply for and receive one or more upper-level USA-SSB awards without making any new contacts.

At its October Meeting, the MARAC Board removed the start date for the USA-SSB Award (which had been February 15, 2015), thus allowing contacts made prior to that date to count toward the initial and higher-level awards. Prior to this change, only nine county hunters had achieved the USA-SSB award and interest in the award was low. After the rule change was announced, applications for the first-time USA-SSB award begin arriving within a few days. In fact, by November 18th, a total of 28 USA-SSB I award applications had been approved, more than triple the pre-change number. As the word spreads about the change in start date, it is likely that even more applications will be received.

In addition, because MARAC rules allow all qualifying contacts made after the last contact for the previous level to count for subsequent levels of an award, many first-time USA-SSB awardees realized that they had sufficient contacts to apply for the USA-SSB II award as soon as they received the initial USA-SSB award. The same would be true for the USA-SSB III, as well as all higher levels.

This created an unusual problem. In normal circumstances, the first station to apply for and receive a new award would be the first station to complete all the work for the awards. Because that station was the first to complete all the work, which is unique achievement, that station would receive the "Number 1" (#1) sequence number. While all sequence numbers are important, the "#1" has always been a sought-after distinction. For any new award getting "#1" serves as a goal for many Ops. Often, the first person to finish the WBOW has put out extra effort to complete the award and make a last county contact. This effort has been recognized by awarding the "#1" sequence number to that individual. However, this is not the case with the USA-SSB II award.

Because eligibility for the USA-SSB II and higher levels is retrospective (based on contacts already made) most of the Ops who receive the first-time USA-SSB award have already made all of the contacts needed for USA-SSB II. The extra effort an Op who wanted #1 USA-SSB II award just doesn't apply where multiple Ops are virtually

eligible at the same time. Date of first application does not work because there is a lot of variability as to when an individual found out about the change of rules, when they realized that they could apply, and when they found time to apply for the award.

Because of the lack of competitive effort for sequent levels in the USA-SSB series, and the slow dissemination of the changes to the USA-SSB award rule, the Board recognized that the conventional method of awarding #1 to the first applicant is inappropriate. Thus, for USA-SSB II, the #1 award will be shared by all Ops whose application is received no later than January 15, 2025. The extension of the deadline for submittal of the USA-SSB II application ensures that all MARAC members are likely to know, understand, and react to the rule change. Thirty-day application extensions will also apply to subsequence levels in the USA-SSB series. For example, if the first valid application for the USA-SSB III is received on 1/16/2025, all valid applications received through February 15, 2025, will receive the #1 sequence number. This process will continue until April 15, 2025, when the special rule applicable to sequence #1 for higher levels will expire.

For all interested SSB Ops, the following procedure will help you get ready and participate in the shared #1 award. If you have not already done so, download the latest version of Logger (at least Version 2.10.38). This version includes implementation of the latest USA-SSB rules changes. Next, if you have not done so, recalculate the USA-SSB award. Then view your status in the Tracked Book Summary of the USA-SSB award. If the Summary shows that you have finished the USA-SSB award, complete the application for the USA-SSB on-line, and send the electronic copy of your USA-SSB log to AB7RW. Be sure to do this before January 15, 2025. Sometime after January 15, 2025, download the Database as directed by Logger. Logger will automatically create the USA-SSB II Logbook, which you should check and recalculate. Check the Tracked Book Summary to determine if it shows that you have completed the requirements for the USA-SSB II award. If you have, apply online like you did for the initial USA-SSB award. If you submit your application before the mid-February deadline, you will share "Number 1". Repeat this process as long as you have sequence awards completed until April 15.
